Ms. Coffey stated that the DSN does not have parking as of a June 7 email and no summonses were issued for parking in the Deal Casino parking lot. Ms. Coffey stated that on July 20th, 362 cars were parked in the Conover parking lot and the new plans don't show that many spaces and asked how that was going to work. Ms. Coffey asked to be at the next planning meeting. Mayor Cohen stated that he would not allow that at would provide plans when he deemed it to be appropriate to release any plans.

MaryAnne Cronheim, 88 Monmouth Drive, stated to the Board of Commissioners that when two members meet, it constitutes a quorum and is considered a meeting and must be public. Mayor Cohen stated that he is the only one that meets with the Planner at this time. Mrs. Cronheim asked when a public meeting will be conducted with the plans, Mayor Cohen stated when he has something worthy to provide, and that it has taken too long because of CAFRA which has held up the process.

Mayor Cohen asked for any additional comments from the public, which there was none and closed the floor to public comments.
