Isadora Chamlin, 5 Poplar Avenue, stated to the Board of Commissioners that there is not one bench facing the Ocean. Mrs. Chamlin also asked the status of the pier. Commissioner Simhon stated that is something that needs to be approved by the State. Mayor Cohen stated that it is a complicated process and the Borough is going through beach replenishment and working on plans for reconstructing the Deal Casino. Mrs. Chamlin asked the Commissioners if they desire to rebuild the pier. Mayor Cohen stated that he would love to see the pier rebuilt. Mrs. Chamlin also stated that the bike riders need to have lights on their bikes. Chief Neuman stated they have given out lights and reflective vests but stated they are not issuing summonses but enforcing verbally.

MaryAnne Cronheim, 88 Monmouth Drive, asked the Board of Commissioners about Resolution 21-151 and who are the 2 parties involved. Mrs. Cronheim was advised it was the Borough and Investors Bank. Rob Moore, Borough Attorney Representative, was not aware the particulars on the agreement.
