ORDINANCE 1289

ORDINANCE OF THE MAYOR AND BOROUGH COMMISSIONERS OF THE BOROUGH OF DEAL, COUTY OF MONMOUTH, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AMENDING AND SUPPPLEMENTING CHAPTER 10 OF THE TRAFFIC CODE 10.37

An Ordinance Regulating the Use of Electric Bikes and E-Scooters within the Borough of Deal

WHEREAS, the Board Commissioners of the Borough of Deal recognizes the increasing popularity and usage of electric bikes (e-bikes) and electric scooters (e-scooters) within the community; and

WHEREAS, the Board Commissioners seek to promote the safe and responsible use of e-bikes and e-scooters in accordance with New Jersey State Title 39 traffic laws; and

WHEREAS, the Board Commissioners aims to ensure the safe parking and storage of e-bikes and e-scooters to prevent potential fire hazards associated with lithium-ion batteries;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Board Commissioners of the Borough of Deal, County of Monmouth, State of New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1: Definitions

For the purpose of this ordinance, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

Electric Bike (E-bike): A bicycle with an integrated electric motor which can be used for propulsion, classified as follows:

Class 1: Pedal-assist e-bike providing assistance only when the rider is pedaling and ceasing to assist at 20 miles per hour.

Class 2: Throttle-assist e-bike that can be used exclusively to propel the bicycle up to 20 miles per hour.

Class 3: Motorized bicycles requiring a license and following more stringent regulations.

Electric Scooter (E-scooter): A scooter with an integrated electric motor, capable of a maximum speed of 19 miles per hour, used primarily for short-distance travel.

Section 2: Applicability

This ordinance applies to all operators of e-bikes and e-scooters within the municipal boundaries of the Borough of Deal.

Section 3: General Regulations

1. Compliance with State Law:

All operators of e-bikes and e-scooters must comply with New Jersey State Title 39 traffic laws and any other applicable state regulations regarding the operation of bicycles and e-scooters.

2. Licensing and Registration:

Operators of Class 1 and Class 2 e-bikes and e-scooters are not required to have a license, registration, or insurance. Class 3 e-bikes require a license, and operators must be at least 15 years old and wear a helmet.

3. Helmet Requirement:

All operators and passengers of e-bikes and e-scooters under the age of 17 must wear a properly fitted and fastened bicycle helmet.

4. Operation on Public Roadways and Paths:

E-bikes and e-scooters may be operated on public roadways, bicycle lanes, and multi-use paths where traditional bicycles are permitted unless otherwise posted by the Town. E-bikes and e-scooters are prohibited from being operated on sidewalks unless explicitly permitted by local rules.

5. Speed Limits:

E-bikes and e-scooters must not exceed a speed of 20 miles per hour. Class 3 e-bikes, which can exceed this speed, must adhere to additional restrictions and requirements.

6. Equipment Requirements:

E-bikes and e-scooters must be equipped with a white front headlamp and a red rear taillight visible from 500 feet during nighttime or low visibility conditions. They must also have a bell or horn audible from 100 feet away. The brakes must be capable of making the wheels skid on dry, clean, level pavement.

Section 4: Parking and Storage

1. Parking Regulations:

E-bikes and e-scooters must be parked in designated bicycle or e-scooter parking areas. They must not obstruct pedestrian walkways, driveways, or building entrances. Parking on sidewalks is prohibited unless explicitly permitted by local signage.

2. Storage Requirements:

E-bikes and e-scooters must be stored in a safe place to prevent fire hazards associated with lithium-ion batteries. This includes:

- Storing e-bikes and e-scooters away from flammable materials and in well-ventilated areas.
- Avoiding overcharging batteries and following manufacturer guidelines for battery maintenance.
 - Regularly inspecting batteries for damage and properly disposing of defective batteries.

Section 5: Penalties

Any person who violates any provision of this ordinance shall be subject to a fine not exceeding \$100 for each offense.

Section 6: Enforcement

This ordinance shall be enforced by the Deal Police Department and other designated municipal officials.

Section 7: Severability

If any section, subsection, clause, or phrase of this ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this ordinance.

Section 8: Effective Date

This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication as required by law.

ORDINANCE 1290

10-17 PARKING OF CERTAIN TRUCKS, VEHICLES, AND TRAILERS PROHIBITED

No person shall park any commercial vehicle, pickup truck, truck, van, a school bus, any other type of bus, recreational vehicle, camper, boat or trailer between the hours specified upon any of the streets or parts of streets described below.

Definitions as Used in this subsection:

Commercial vehicle shall mean any motor vehicle, truck, pickup truck or van licensed or designated for use or used for the transportation of property or other commercial purposes on the streets and highways of New Jersey such as the regular providing and delivery of goods, wares, merchandise and services.

Pickup truck shall mean a truck or other motor vehicle with an open back designed, used or maintained primarily for the regular transportation of property or delivery of services. Truck shall mean every motor vehicle designed, used or maintained primarily for regular transportation of property or delivery of services.

Van shall mean an enclosed motor vehicle designed, used or maintained primarily for regular transportation of property or delivery of services.

Exceptions. Nothing herein shall be deemed to prohibit the parking of commercial vehicles, pickup trucks, trucks, vans, a recreational vehicle, camper, busses, boat or trailer or equipment related thereto, on a residential street while it is being used in the transaction of business with the owner or occupant of residential property in the area or is in the area for the purpose of installing, maintaining or performing public utility services.

Trailer: The use of a trailer or camper for living purposes as heretofore stated is prohibited within the jurisdictional limits of the Borough of Deal.

An unoccupied commercial vehicle, trailer or camper may be parked or placed on any private property within the jurisdictional limits of the Borough of Deal only if the commercial vehicle, trailer or camper is kept in a garage or other building completely enclosed and not readily visible to adjoining property owners or to the general public. Except in commercial zones designated by the Borough of Deal.

Trailers used or intended to be used temporarily for educational use are not included in the above definition of trailer.

Lt. Hulse explained a new system has been developed for the residents to report street light outages. A form is available on the Deal Police Department's webpage to report out streetlights. Mayor Cohen feels it is important to research the past shared service agreement with Ocean Township to trim the trees blocking streetlights.

Chief Ronen discussed a shared service with the County to clean out the storm drains. The Army Corps of Engineers installed the outflow pipe too short and are aware of it. The Army Corps of Engineers will address the issues when they revisit the next beach replenishment project.

Commissioner Simhon explained that there is an issue with stones popping up on Poplar Avenue while bike riding requesting the street sweeper clean up the road.

The Department of Public Works will trim the trees and paint SLOW on the corner of Monmouth Drive- for safety reasons. Commissioner Simhon suggests a stop sign installed. Mayor Cohen further suggests a four-way stop. A discussion ensued concerning the issue with a four-way stop. Lt. Hulse reported the Department of Public Works will replace the stop sign located at Jerome Avenue and Pleasant Place.
